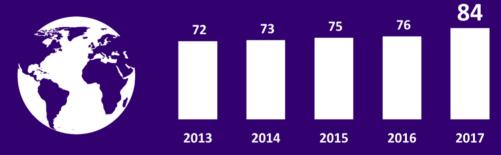

Managed and reconciled multiple bank accounts with annual deposits of \$548 million

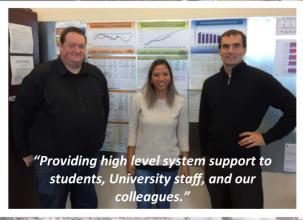
